

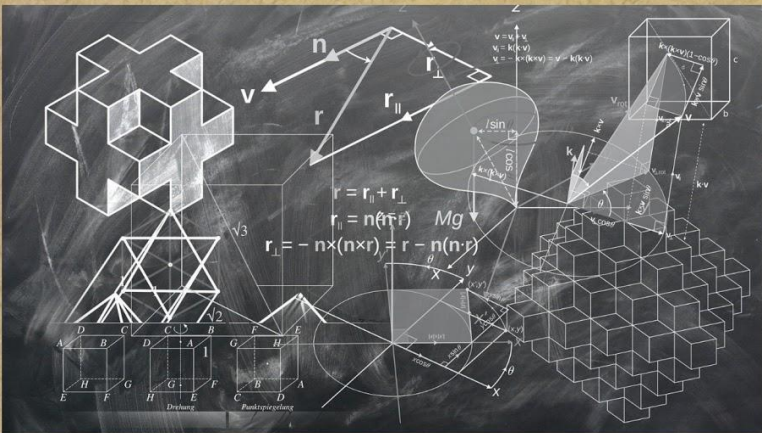

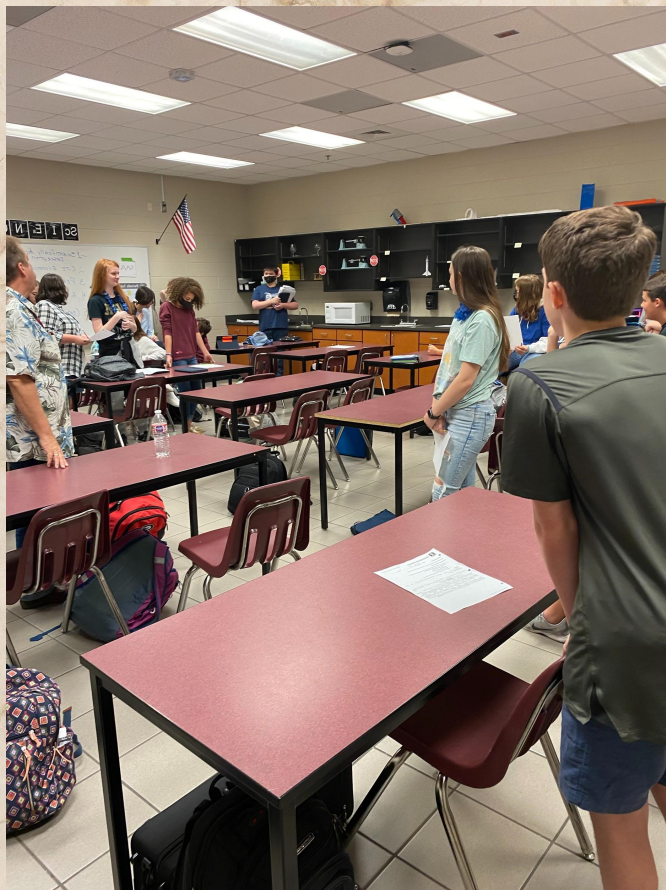

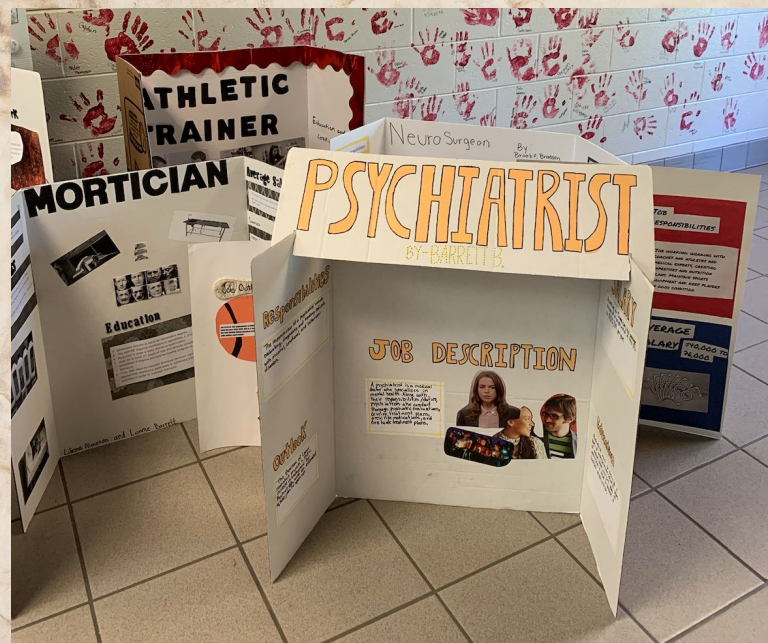




# Career Pathways

# Community Service

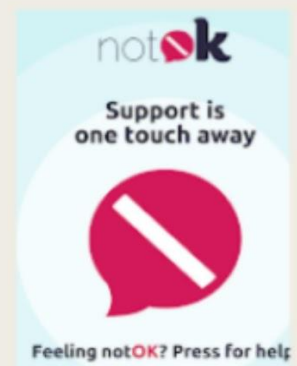
